Memorial Service Honors Those Who Died in Work-Related Accidents

A daughter is on a mission to remember her father and others who died while on the job.

Danielle Dole lost her father, Sherman Holmes to a logging accident in 2011.

Holmes was well known in Osceola County for his 30 years of service at Pine River High School.

After his death, Dole wanted to honor him and help others deal with losing a loved one in a work-related accident.

Tonight, Dole held the first ever Michigan's Workers' Memorial Day service in Cadillac where many families gathered to honor their loved ones. "This is the first but it's not the last, it's going to happen every year, it may not happen in Cadillac but wherever it takes me this is going to be a constant thing," says Danielle Dole, event organizer.

Around 4,500 people die, while working, each year.


On average, more than sixty of those victims are Nebraskans—like 25-year-old Ryan Hitchler, who died from a work injury, in Lincoln, in 2009.
